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received the information about the arrival of this man and relevant sources reported that the amount of heroin he was carrying was 40 kilograms. Of course, the recovered amount weighed 24 kilograms. Although the recovered amount was the biggest so far, this is not the biggest smuggling incident. This drug smuggling has become a routine affair. This consignment was brought in a novel way. The heroin were packed in 118 beautiful packets of Lux soaps, similar to the soaps sent to the Middle Eastern countries. This brown colored heroin is sold in Europe and the United States at very high prices. Every 200 grams of this variety of heroin is sold in the black-market in London for 20,000 pounds. In fact, heroin is the major source of income for the Taleban government that has seized power in Afghanistan. It is not the Taleban Government alone; heroin is also a major source of earning for the Inter Service Intelligence ISI of Pakistan, which has been providing support and assistance to the Taleban Government in Afghanistan. The lion's share of the funds earned from heroin smuggling is spent on intelligence service and also on subversive activities carried out by the ISI in neighboring countries. This heroin earns the money needed for carrying out destructive activities in neighboring countries. It cannot be said that Rais Khan did not come to Bangladesh with 40 kilograms of heroin. A part of this heroin must have been smuggled out by the time the accused persons were arrested in Dhaka. They would not have been arrested if the smuggling had taken place in a city other than Dhaka. The national dailies, including the Janakantha, published reports on 21 September saying that international drug traffickers

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
