Hello ISAC partners: we have taken a look at this case through the day. We'd like to point out the progression already documented in is thread; most of the misinformation is domestic, blue-check influencers (b)(6) drove the bulk of the spread, The Blaze covered it, and this provided collateral/fuel for Russian state-linked actors to push the narrative on Parler, bolstering the overall meta-narrative that ballots fraud is happening left and right. HOWEVER, to maintain full context, pushing it to Parler is largely preaching to the choir, and it likely got very minimal engagement there. So while this confirms that state-affiliated actors are involved in spreading disinformation, the issue is far more complex and an issue regardless of who is spreading it.

We will be working on a larger case study given this example of how to understand the historical context and best responses when it is found that foreign actors were involved with disinformation events leading up to November, and will be sure to send this your way. Our Graphika partners will take one more look at this tomorrow in case theres other context they can add.
